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Purpose and impact:

The SEND Practitioner provides targeted, time-limited support to children and young people aged 0–19 with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND), their families, and educational settings.

The postholder will work collaboratively with parents, carers, Early Years settings, schools, and multi-agency professionals to assess needs, plan and deliver evidence-based interventions, and review impact. The role aims to strengthen inclusive practice, build capacity within settings and families, and improve outcomes for children and young people with SEND.

Accountable to:

This role reports to the Senior SEND Practitioner or SEND Manager in the Inclusion and Intervention Support Team (IIST). The role sits within Children and Young People's Services, part of the People Services Directorate in West Northamptonshire Council.

Responsibilities:

1. Deliver direct, hands-on, time-limited interventions with children and young people with SEND and/or disabilities, as well as modelling strategies for parents, carers, and education staff to promote inclusion, development, and wellbeing.
2. Manage an active caseload, responding flexibly to changing levels of demand. Act as Lead Professional where required, coordinating support, chairing Team Around the Family meetings, and completing Early Help Assessments.
3. Undertake observations, assessments, and reviews across educational, home, and community settings. Analyse needs and progress, and provide tailored advice, guidance, and recommendations to support inclusive practice.
4. Work collaboratively with professionals across education, health, and social care services, attending multi-agency meetings as required to ensure coordinated and appropriate support for children, young people, and families.
5. Maintain accurate, timely, and comprehensive records of work undertaken, including intervention plans, case notes, reviews, and outcome data. Produce written reports and professional documentation, including evidence to support requests for Education, Health and Care (EHC) needs assessments.
6. Develop, implement, and adapt individualised plans and strategies in partnership with families, settings, and managers, based on ongoing assessment and review of impact.
7. Support transitions between educational settings by working closely with SENCOs, parents/carers, and partner agencies, ensuring continuity, inclusion, and equality of opportunity.
8. Contribute to the design and delivery of training and workshops for parents, carers, education staff, volunteers, and other professionals. Support and mentor colleagues and volunteers, including newly qualified practitioners, through joint visits, coaching, and reflective practice.
9. Contribute to the development, maintenance, and effective use of specialist resources, including assistive equipment and digital tools, staying informed of current research and developments in SEND practice.
10. Plan, facilitate, and review group-based support opportunities for parents and children with SEND, promoting peer support, parental confidence, and skill development.
11. Ensure compliance with health and safety, safeguarding, and data protection requirements, taking reasonable care for personal and others' wellbeing in line with organisational policies.
12. Promote equality, inclusion, and anti-discriminatory practice at all times, actively challenging bias

and barriers related to disability, race, gender, culture, religion, or sexuality.

13. Undertake other duties appropriate to the grade and purpose of the role as required.
