Purpose of the job

The PEEP Coordinator will lead the implementation and delivery of the PEEP Learning Together Programme across North Northamptonshire. The PEEP Learning Together Programme (LTP) is an evidence based programme that covers five strands of child development: personal, social and emotional development, communication and language, early literacy, early maths and health and physical development. The role will help support school readiness for 3 and 4 year olds. This dynamic role combines direct delivery with strategic partnership development to embed PEEP into local systems supporting children and families.

The postholder will support the delivery of PEEP Communication Groups across Family Hub sites, community venues, and early years settings, while developing outreach models for services supporting families in the home. A key part of the role will be engaging and training professionals from the Voluntary and Community Sector, Faith Groups, and other stakeholders to build capacity and increase the reach of PEEP in communities.

Principal responsibilities

- 1. Co-ordinate and deliver PEEP Groups across satellite sites including family hubs, community settings, and early years providers.
- 2. Promote and expand the PEEP Learning Together Programme across North Northamptonshire, raising its profile with professionals, families, and wider stakeholders.
- 3. Build and maintain partnerships with local services, VCS organisations, faith groups, and education providers to embed PEEP into community delivery.
- 4. Train and support professionals and volunteers across sectors to deliver PEEP and use PEEP principles in their work with families.
- 5. Develop home-based and outreach models of PEEP delivery, supporting services that work in families' homes to integrate evidence-based early learning strategies.
- 6. Enable self-referral pathways into universal PEEP Groups for families across the area.
- 7. Raise awareness of early speech, language, and communication needs and how PEEP can support the home learning environment.
- 8. Make effective use of existing digital platforms and resources to support home learning, parenting, and access to universal advice, information, and services. This will include the use of targeted digital pathways, such as EasyPeasy, to promote speech and language development.
- 9. Monitor and evaluate the impact of PEEP delivery, ensuring fidelity to the programme and reporting progress to funders and stakeholders.
- 10. Work collaboratively with Family Hub staff, Speech and Language Therapists, and Early Years professionals to align delivery with local priorities.

11. The PEEP Coordinator will work with families from a range of diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds across North Northamptonshire. Where a need is identified, language support services will be arranged to ensure accessibility and inclusion. This includes the delivery of parenting groups in non-English languages and working with interpreters to support effective communication and engagement.
